### 1. Approval of the agenda and minutes

#### 2. Information from the chairman

#### Error in examination grading at M.Sc. MED course exam

Due to a mistake the grades in the PFT course (fall 2019, CPH) were given as 7-point scale. In the study plan and the course description it was stated that it should have been pass/fail. The students that followed this course have been asked if they would like to keep their grade or change it to pass/fail. 2 out of 4 students opted to keep their grade.

**Covid-19:** All exams for this Spring semester will be online exams. AAU will continuously inform about the situation. There is right now focus on plans to open up for laboratories it if is allowed by the government. The department will inform about this, if it is going to be the case.

Guidelines regarding online exams will be compiled by the Head of Studies as soon as possible.

The student guidance has already had some questions from students regarding online exams.

We had a debate about what to do, if students cheat at exams.

It is important that we wait and read the information that comes from AAU.

If students are having problems with meeting their project hand-in deadline, they are encouraged to send an application to the Study Board and apply for an extension. It is of course important that this process is handled in collaboration with the supervisor. It could be Covid-19 related if they cannot collect the imperical data, or if they need the laboratory to test the material.

#### **Kvote 2 admission**

The Kvote 2 intake for the Medialogy B.Sc. in both AAL and CPH is significantly lower than normal. For many years the Kvote 2 numbers have been good indicatos as to how many potential students will apply in total. Currently it looks as if the total number of applicants will be critically low. Right now the Department has arranged a lot of PR activity to increase the interest for the program. Historical data show that students with lower than 7 in Math B Math grades from highschoos, have a significantly increased risk of dropping out. We had a debate about this. We hope that there are some Covid-19 disturbance in the figures.

## 6. Student self-reported reasons for terminating study programs (01.2020)

It is very difficult to get an overview of these figures. The main numbers shows that the students feel the study was not what they thought it would be, or they lost interest. We had a small debate about the PR material and what could improve the material to better present the nature of the programme. Some students drop out due to health issues. There is always a certain fraction of students suffering stress, depressions or various mental diagnoses.

#### 7. Students in risk of dropping out, march 2020

The Study Board was presented with the march 2020 figures regarding students in risk of dropping out. There appears to be many SSD students in red/yellow, but that is a mistake in the way data were drawn. Only 4 in yellow and 5 in red should actually be in the statistics. The mistake is now corrected. The secretariat will send out letters to the students soon and invite them to meetings with the study guidance or the secretaries.

# 8. Semester evaluation reports, fall 2019 CPH

- LID7 It seems generally the semester has gone well. It has been a challenge to introduce the program to the students with a lot of different backgrounds, both in terms of scientific communication and in terms of learning to study according to a project oriented model.
- **MED3C** It seems the semester went well. There is a bit of study environment issues in the report.
- **MED7C** PFT course the students lack theory. CBM informs that it will have focus in the revision work. Grade statistics MLMT course many students are not doing well at all.
- **SMC7C** The semester went pretty well. Grade statistics looks okay.
- **SMC9C** The survey is not well designed for students in POWIAC. Head of studies is aware of the problem.
- Design course has been challenging again. The exam format was described more detailed before the semester started. Still misunderstandings could encurr.
- Again the survey is not well designed for students in POWIAC. Too little information. The one course was very well evaluated.



#### **AAL**

**MED1A** The semester went fine without major challenges. TA lacked in the programming course in the beginning of the semester – but it is taken care of. We had a debate about the study program in the B.Sc.

MED5A The semester has run nicely. Statistics regarding students spending hours per week. 69% spend less hours per week than required – not satisfactorily. We had a debate about the MED5 structure and the alignment between CGP and RAT. It might change in the future.

MED7A Complaints regarding the Perception and Cognition course. It is super binary – we see both students who likes it and others who hate it. The coordinator states that the department needs to find anonther teacher for this course. Students find that the teacher is not putting enough effort into the teaching. The teacher tends to give focus and good feedback in the projects that are of high scientific interest.

The study board approves that CBM and the secretariat continues the work with the semester evaluation reports from fall 2019. We expect to receive the lacking reports soon.
