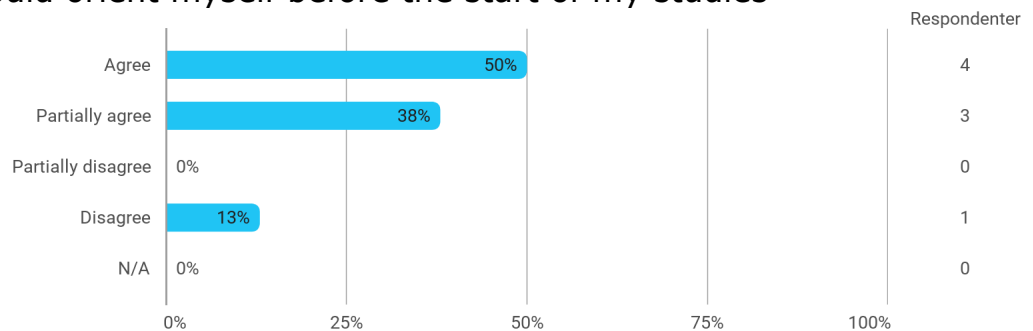
The experience of information and introduction: - I received relevant information before study start about the content and organisation of the programme (e.g. reading list, timetables, semester description)

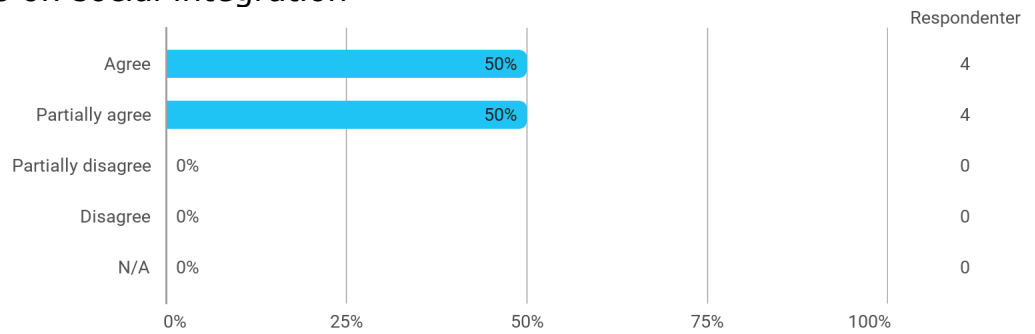
I hope I can get to know my professors and peers earlier

My course personally didnt get a tutor because they were sick, which meant we never got a proper tour around campus.

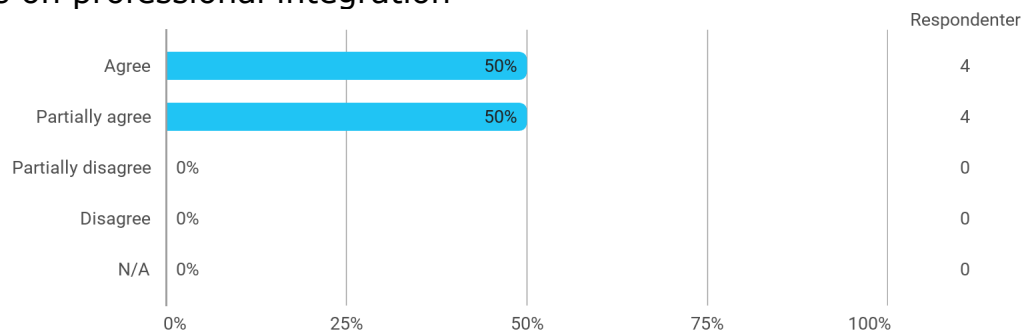
I think every education should have tutors and backup-tutors to make sure this doesnt happen

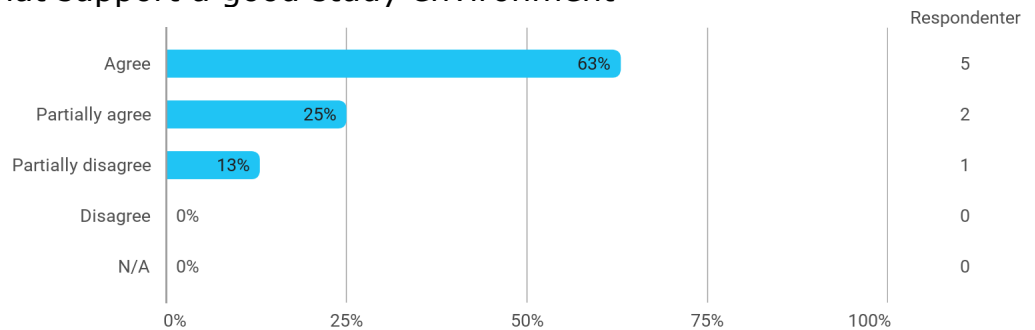
The experience of social and professional activities - In my experience, there has been a focus on social integration



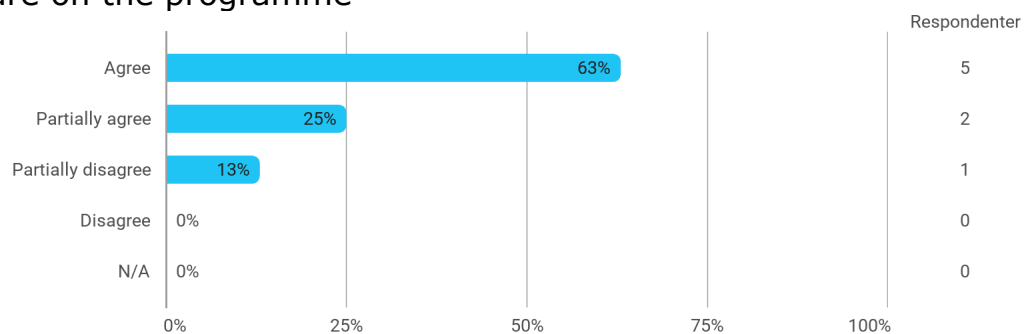
The experience of social and professional activities - I experience that there has been a focus on professional integration



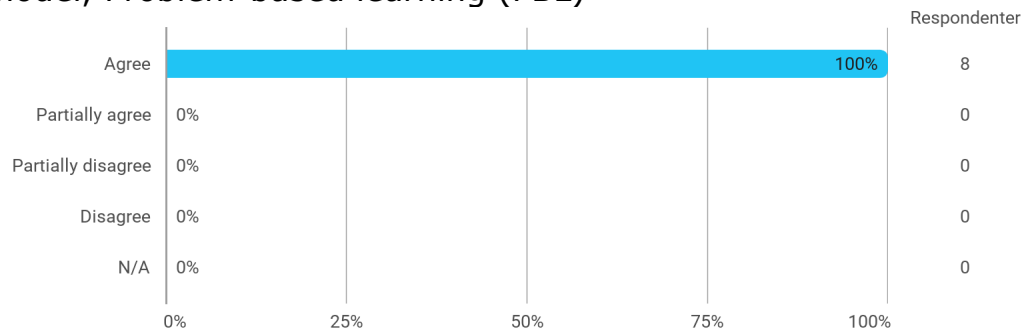
The experience of social and professional activities - I find that there have been activities that support a good study environment



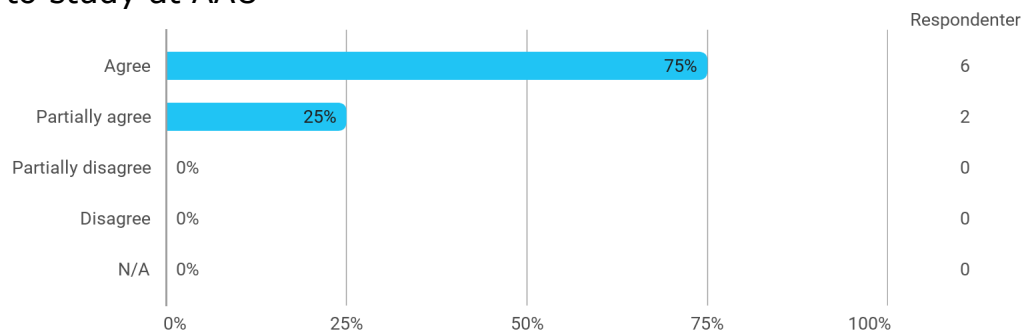
The experience of social and professional activities - I have been presented with how much time I can be expected to spend on the programme and what activities there are on the programme



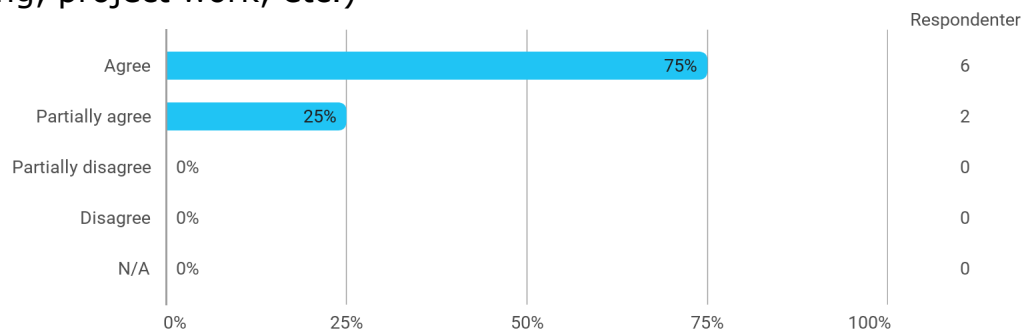
The experience of social and professional activities - I have been introduced to AAU's learning model, Problem-based learning (PBL)



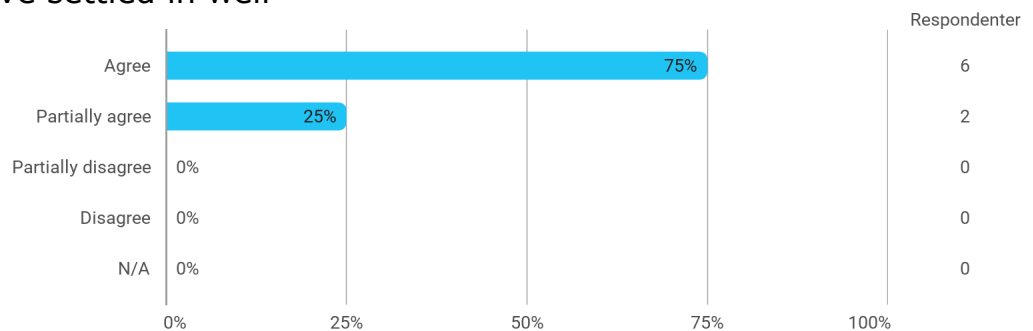
The experience of social and professional activities - Through the introduction to AAU's learning model, Problem-based learning (PBL), I have gained an idea of what it is like to study at AAU



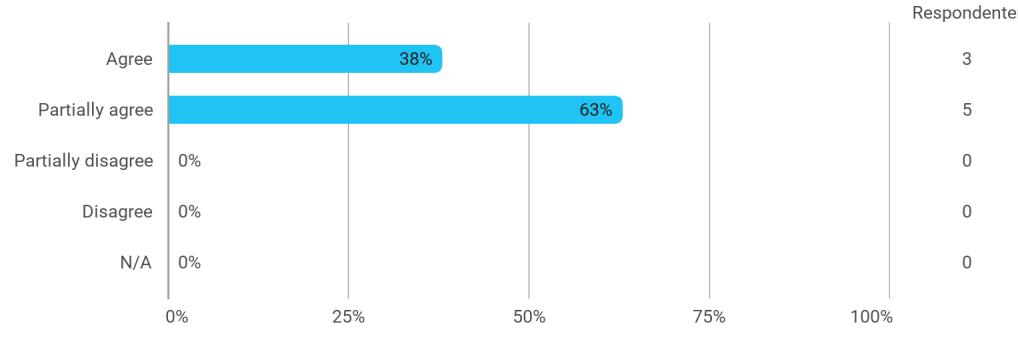
The experience of social and professional activities - Through the start of my studies, I have gained insight into the academic content of the programme (courses, teaching, project work, etc.)



The experience of the study start overall - I get along well with my fellow students and have settled in well



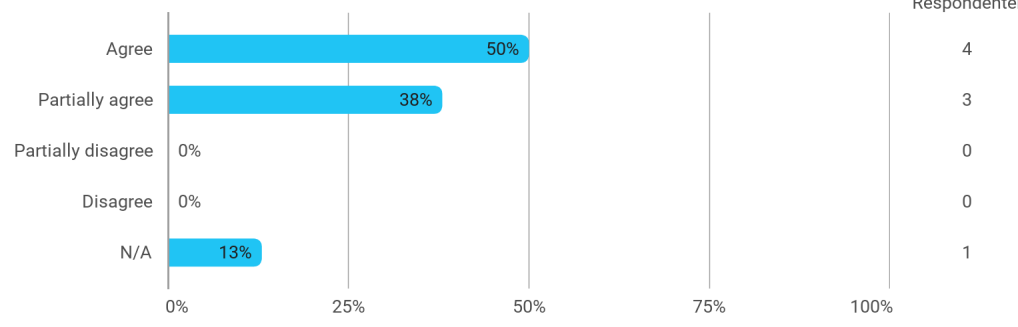
The experience of the study start overall - Overall, I am satisfied with the start of my studies
