Reorganisations as a Part of the "Archival Everyday"

- Social and political developments lead to frequent reorganizations and changes of public bodies and public functions.
- Privatisation of public bodies and functions



The National Archives' New Appraisal Strategy 2017

- The mission: "We document the present for the future"
- Two strategic goals:
- 1) The National Archives' collection must ensure an opportunity for a holistic description of the Danish society.
- 2) To ensure that the National Archives' collection and preservation work is carried out in close cooperation with authorities and private actors to ensure that the right records are designated for preservation.
- The legislative and financial framework



Implementation of the Strategy: The Veterans' Project

Aims:

- 1. Survey of relevant archival associations and records
- 2. Strategy for contact with private associations: how, when and who.
- 3. Description of what is worthy of preservation.
- 4. For private associations agreements on handing over records to the Archives
