1. Study plan revision Medialogy MSc.:

This extraordinary meeting is planned for the study board to hopefully approve the revision of the Medialogy MSc. study plan, starting from 2022. The revision has an impact on our Sound and Music MSc. Study plan and it will also start from 2022. See the attached documents for both study plans.

At the last study board meeting many topics were debated and it was clear that it was not possible to approve the revised study plan. During the last week, there has been debates about possible changes that would support an approval of the study plan. These changes are listed in an attached document and also mentioned below.



We went through the comments:

7th semester:

The project unit is now reduced to 15 ECTS rather than 20 ECTS. Learning goals are more readable and flexible.

Students now have to choose 2 elective courses rather than just 1.

We offer 3 elective courses in this semester:

- **Real-time Computer Graphics** (learning goal description has changed significantly)
- Mobile and Wearable Computing (learning goal description has changed significantly)
- Narratives in Interactive Systems (text is still missing)

Regarding the Narratives in Interactive Systems course, text is still missing due to illness in the course designer team. The team is working on it right now. However, the course will look a lot like the previous course "Narratives in Digital Media" from the 2020 study plan.

8th semester:

The project unit is also reduced to 15 ECTS rather than 20 ECTS. Learning goals are more readable and flexible.

The learning goal description for the mandatory course *Multi-Sensory Interaction and Media Cognition* has changed significantly.

Students now have to choose 2 elective courses rather than just 1. This semester we offer 4 elective courses:

- Signal Processing for Interaction
- Embodied Interaction
- Spatial User Interfaces
- Game Research and Development

9th semester:

This semester we offer the students

- · Project oriented study in an external collaboration or
- DADIU

Both in 30 ECTS

10. semester:

The learning goal description for the MED10 project still requires much more work. Some of the topics will be with standardized PBL learning goals. A document was presented at the meeting. CBM will finish the text.

The study board approves the new revised study plan.



Sound and Music Computing MSc.:

This study plan is affected by the changes in the MSc Medialogy study plan. The changes will take place in the 2022 study plan version and start September 1, 2022.

SMC2: Embodied Interaction will be updated by the new course with the same name.

SMC3: Prototyping and Fabrication Techniques course is removed from the list of electives

SMC3: Multimodal Perception and Cognition is removed from list of electives

SMC3: Project unit Sound and Music Innovation gets increased from 15 ECTS to 20 ECTS

SMC3: There will be 2 mandatory courses on this semester

- Research in Sound and Music Computing
- Machine Learning for Media Experiences (the new version of the Machine Learning for Media Technology course)

CBM has been in contact with Stefania Serafin with the changes. And she has already approved it.
